Sticky Knowledge - What I already know

- I know how to use sketches to produce a final piece of art.
- I know how to use different grades of pencil to shade and to show different tones and textures.
- I know how to use marks and lines to show texture in my art.
- I know how to use line, tone, shape and colour to represent figures and forms I movement.
- I know how to show facial expressions and body language in sketches and paintings.
- I know how to use more than one colour to layer in a print.
- I know how to replicate patterns from observations.
- I know how to print onto different materials using at least four colours.
- I know how to cut, make and combine shapes to create recognisable forms.
- I know how to add materials to the sculpture to create detail.

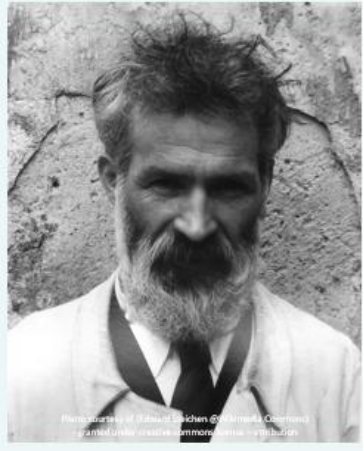

Key Vocabulary	Definition
hard	Make light, neat lines that are good for details.
soft	Make dark lines that are good for shading and adding tone.
tiles	Flat pieces of material, often ceramic, clay, or stone, that can be decorated and arranged to create patterns, pictures, or mosaics.
wire	A thin, flexible metal material that can be bent, twisted, and shaped to create structures, sculptures, and forms.
technical vocabulary	Special words used in art to describe techniques, materials, processes, and equipment accurately.
arrange	To organise, position, or place objects carefully to create a planned design or composition.
