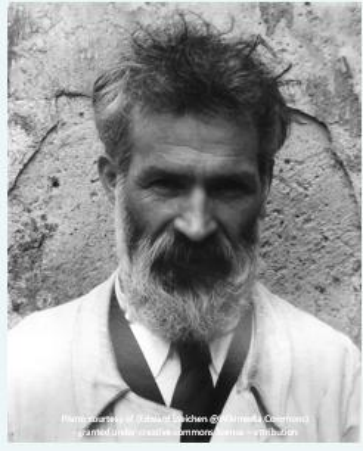

Key Vocabulary	Definition
texture	How something feels or looks like it would feel, such as rough, smooth, bumpy, or soft.
outline	The line around the outside edge of a shape or object.
block printing ink	A special thick ink used to print designs from a printing block onto paper or fabric.
form	The shape of an object that has height, width, and depth, making it look three-dimensional (3D).
evaluate	To think about what went well and what could be improved in your artwork.
polystyrene printing tiles	Soft foam sheets that artists press lines and patterns into to create printing blocks.
inking rollers	Tools used to spread ink evenly onto a printing block before printing. They are also called brayers .
layer	One part placed on top of another. Artists can add layers of colour, paint, ink, or materials to create effects.
