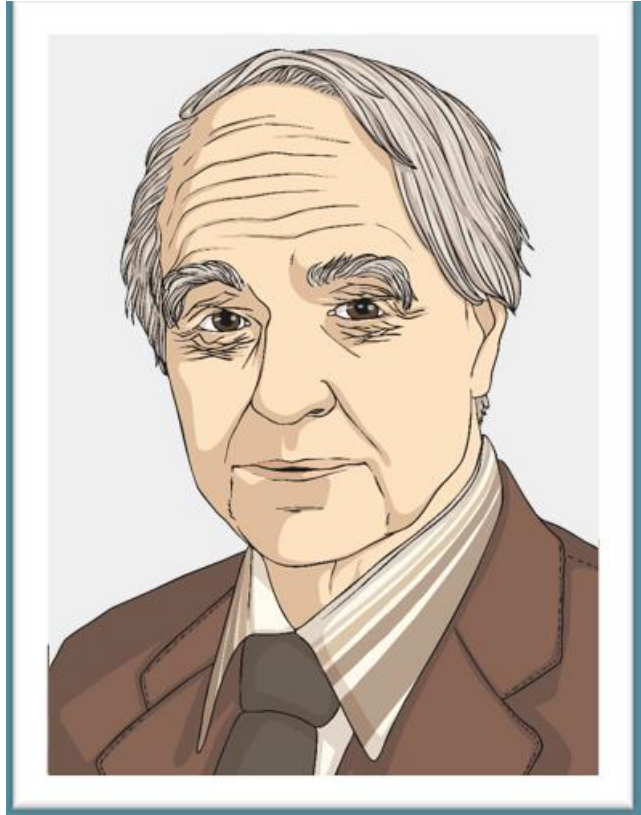

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Outline	A line that goes around the edge of a shape or figure, showing its outer form. It's like a boundary or border that helps define the object in a picture.
Shape	A shape is a flat space made by lines. Shapes can be geometric (like circles, squares) or organic (like leaves or clouds). Example: A triangle is a geometric shape; a puddle is an organic shape.
Tone	Tone means how light or dark something is. Artists use tone to show depth, shadow, and highlights. Example: A ball might have light tones where the light hits it and dark tones in the shadows.
Joining techniques	Joining techniques are ways to connect pieces of material together when making art, especially in sculpture or model making. Examples: Glue - sticking things together Stapling or sewing - joining fabric or paper Scoring and folding - for joining paper or card Slip and score - for joining clay pieces
Sculpt	To sculpt means to shape or carve a material like clay, wood, or stone into a 3D form. Example: You can sculpt a model of an animal out of clay.
