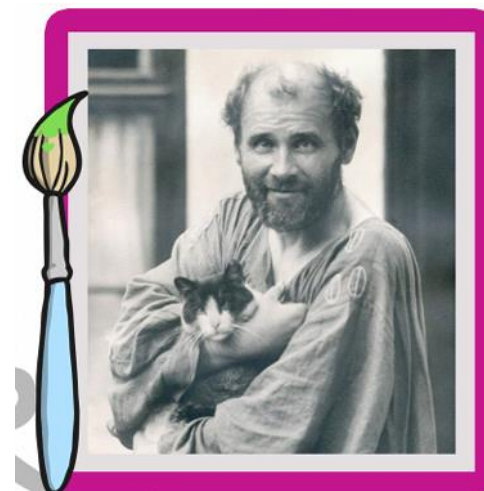

wax	a solid yellow substance that is made with fats or oils. It melts when you heat it for a short time
weaving	to make cloth by passing threads over and under each other.

Batik	a technique for dyeing that involves covering certain areas of the fabric with removable wax in order to repel the dye.
decorative	adding to how attractive a thing is visually

woven	to make cloth by passing threads over and under each other.
