Generation	Group of people born around the same time.
Blackboard	A big board, usually black or green, that teachers write on with chalk to teach lessons in the classroom.
Punishment	What happens when someone does something wrong and they have to face the consequences, like a timeout or losing privileges.
Dictation	When someone reads words out loud, and you write them down.
Сарра	A cape or cloak that people used to wear over their clothes to keep warm or dry
Apron	Something you wear over your clothes to keep them clean
